

SECOND SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

Surfcoast Anglican Parish

18 June 2017

Today's readings: Exodus 19.2-8a; Psalm 100; Romans 5.1-11; Matthew 9.35-10.8

In today's Gospel story, when Jesus sees the crowds 'harassed and helpless' - presumably with the cares of life and the indifference of political systems, or economic systems, or governmental systems - Jesus has compassion on them.

So he sends his disciples out to *bring* the good news of God's kingdom to the people, and to *be* the good news to them. This is what evangelism is about. This is what mission is about. This is what being a disciple is about. This is what being a Christian - a follower of Christ - is about. This is what *we* are about.

So how do we do this? Do we put money in the collection plate and have fund-raising initiatives so that we can hire a professional to do it for us? Or do we ask this question seriously for ourselves, and join in the discussion and the learning about what is relevant for ourselves, and for our culture and community?

We look around the Surf Coast, Australia, and the world, and we see so much need for the love and peace of God, for the insight and enlightenment of Jesus, for the life and wisdom of the Spirit - we can see the need plainly, because the harvest is plentiful.

Can we hear the call of God, through Jesus, calling us as disciples to labour in this harvest? And when we do, are we prepared to be honest and, where relevant, say 'I don't know how to do this effectively' - not in order to reject the call, but as a starting point to learning?

Maintenance Committee notes: 13 June

- St Luke's hall & kitchen electrics: all the niggly issues have been fixed the only remaining recommendation is to put the hall light switches outside of the fuse box.
- Architectural plans for St Luke's have been obtained from the Shire, so now planning can proceed with upgrading the car park ramps.
- We are awaiting the builders to give a start date to constructing the Op Shop awning.
- St Aidan's blinds are being assessed for replacement.

The votive candle space at St Luke's

In front of the pulpit at St Luke's - which is hardly ever used as a pulpit - there is sand in a tub with a candle. Before and after services, and during communion, people like to light a taper and put in the the sand, as a tangible sign of prayer for loved ones and themselves. We are encouraged in our faith when we do it ourselves, and also when we see others doing it - it is both personal and corporate.

During communion there can be a traffic jam in that corner, because the space is cramped, and old joints find it hard to get down to the tub on the floor, and up again.

There have been a number of quiet conversations about reorganising that corner: replacing the pulpit with a table-height broad shelf against the wall, which would support sand bowls for the tapers. Readers and intercessors can easily make use of the lectern instead.

The pulpit was donated 'in memory of Stanley Thomas Tuck / a loyal churchwarden & a diligent worker for this church / called to higher service 28th Dec 1956'. This plaque would be kept, with something extra along the lines of: 'the wood from the pulpit has been repurposed to provide support for prayers offered up to God'. I am confident we can compose wording that honours the past while valuing transformed use.

Ken and Chris Farrow have acquired an icon of Christ for St Luke's from their recent trip to Greece, which, if placed above the proposed votive candle shelf, would provide a good focus for contemplation - for those who wish to.

As you observe or participate in the 'traffic jam' in that space during communion, think about this idea - prayerfully.
