Current Restrictions - Our main services are mixed services of lower numbers (20). Wednesday vaccinated only (30) at Torquay. Booking on Sunday at Torquay not for Anglesea, extras to 20 will be turned away. No booking Wednesday. Mask wearing inside and outside other than the leader. Digital Check in. Hall meetings max 20 people and 4sqm rule. Funerals 20, weddings 10. Morning teas can be served and people must be seated. Home groups 10. Op Shop 4sqm rule and no vacc check for customers.

We are planning for Christmas to be affected by some of these requirements.

#### **General News**

Vaccinated/Unvaccinated/Mixed Services - The Roadmap has put us in the position of managing activities in light of one's vaccination status and spot checks have occurred in Geelong. I (Sharon) have taken our Council's input which was split between 2 alternatives for Torquay. After much consideration I have decided our main services will be OPEN TO ALL.

On Sunday at both centres this means we continue with our current pattern. 20 max, check in but no-one will be asked about vaccination. Wednesday 10:30 at Torquay the service will start for vaccinated ONLY, this gathering may suit those concerned about mixed gathering for any reason, you will need to show your certificate of vaccination.

This way we show a lack of discrimination regarding vaccination, we act with hospitality AT OUR MAIN SERVICE - it may be that no one who is unvaccinated attends but we put our selves in a position of welcome anyway. It is a statement with strong theological grounds. And those who are vaccinated have 2 alternatives to gather.

Remember only a few months ago none of us were vaccinated, and recently only some of us were, but we gathered together when lockdowns did not prevent us without discriminating. Now most of us have lowered the risk for ourselves, we can continue as we started, taking precautions as usual and gathering together. Regulars can therefore meet at either service, or both, as they feel comfortable.

I believe this is an opportunity to put into action the instructions of Jesus, to take up his invitation to live as his disciples. A letter is available on the notice board outlining my reasons, I am happy to discuss this. I know some will disagree with me, which includes half of Council. I feel compelled to take this path.

In addition I want to emphasise the importance of individual responsibilities each week:

- Show respect and courtesy to the door person who checks numbers etc.
- CHECK IN digitally every time you attend the shop, hall or church.
- On Sunday at Torquay, you MUST BOOK IN. Call Roger or John Born during the week.
   Once the 20 limit is reached folk will be turned away. No exceptions from now on.
- If you are turned away, do not take offence, this is what we have to do.
- At the Wednesday Service you must show your Vaccination certificate.
