Christ yesterday and today, the beginning and the end - Alpha, Omega; all times belong to him and all the ages, to him be glory and power through every age for ever. By his holy and glorious wounds may Christ our Lord guard us and keep us

A reading from the prophet Isaiah:

On this mountain the Lord of hosts will make for all peoples a feast of rich food, a feast of well-matured wines, of rich food filled with marrow, of well-matured wines strained clear. And he will destroy on this mountain the shroud that is cast over all peoples, the sheet that is spread over all nations; he will swallow up death for ever.

Then the Lord God will wipe away the tears from all faces, and the disgrace of his people he will take away from all the earth, for the Lord has spoken. It will be said on that day, Lo, this is our God; we have waited for him, so that he might save us. This is the Lord for whom we have waited; let us be glad and rejoice in his salvation.

Isaiah 25:6-9

Hear the word of the Lord, **thanks be to God.**

We say the Hymn to the Risen Christ alternately:

Christ our Passover has been sacrificed for us: so let us
celebrate the feast,

**Not with the old leaven of corruption and wickedness:
but with the unleavened bread of sincerity and truth**

Christ once raised from the dead dies no more: death has no
more dominion over him.

**In dying he died to sin once for all:
in living he lives to God**

See yourselves therefore as dead to sin: and alive to God in
Jesus Christ our Lord.

**Christ has been raised from the dead:
the first fruits of those who sleep**

For as by one man came death: by another has come also
resurrection of the dead;

**For as in Adam all die: even so in Christ shall all be made
alive**

Now I should remind you, sisters and brothers, of the good
news that I proclaimed to you, which you in turn received, in
which also you stand, through which also you are being saved,
if you hold firmly to the message that I proclaimed to you -
unless you have come to believe in vain.

For I handed on to you as of first importance what I in turn
had received: that Christ died for our sins in accordance with
the scriptures, and that he was buried, and that he was raised
on the third day in accordance with the scriptures, and that
he appeared to Cephas, then to the twelve. Then he appeared
to more than five hundred sisters and brothers at one time,
most of whom are still alive, though some have died. Then he
appeared to James, then to all the apostles.

Last of all, as to someone untimely born, he appeared also to
me. For I am the least of the apostles, unfit to be called an

apostle, because I persecuted the church of God. But by the grace of God I am what I am, and his grace towards me has not been in vain.

On the contrary, I worked harder than any of them - though it was not I, but the grace of God that is with me. Whether then it was I or they, so we proclaim and so you have come to believe.

When the Sabbath was over, Mary Magdalene, Mary the mother of James, and Salome bought spices so that they might go to anoint Jesus' body. Very early on the first day of the week, just after sunrise, they were on their way to the tomb and they asked each other, "Who will roll the stone away from the entrance of the tomb?"

But when they looked up, they saw that the stone, which was very large, had been rolled away. As they entered the tomb, they saw a young man dressed in a white robe sitting on the right side, and they were alarmed.

"Don't be alarmed," he said. "You are looking for Jesus the Nazarene, who was crucified. He has risen! He is not here. See the place where they laid him. But go, tell his disciples and

Peter, ‘He is going ahead of you into Galilee. There you will see him, just as he told you.’”

Trembling and bewildered, the women went out and fled from the tomb. They said nothing to anyone, because they were afraid.
